Dear Parents & Caregivers, Tena koutou katoa

Having greater access to devices through BYOD and school provided devices has improved student engagement and motivation, and allowed students to continue with their learning at home. There has also been increased communication with home and school and parents are more involved with their child's learning.

BYOD is **not compulsory** for students, but it is an option if students and their parents wish to take it up. Please understand that those students who do not bring a device from home will not be disadvantaged. We are still committed to providing access to ICT for all students. Information will come home to the parents of this year's Year 4 and 5 students with their end of year report.

Next week Koru syndicate has a trip planned to Te Papa and Patu students will be involved in a range of EOTC activities. Thanks so much to all the teachers who have spent considerable time organising these activities for our students. Fingers crossed the weather is good!

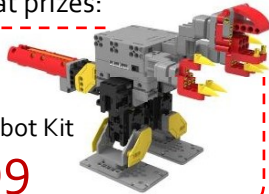

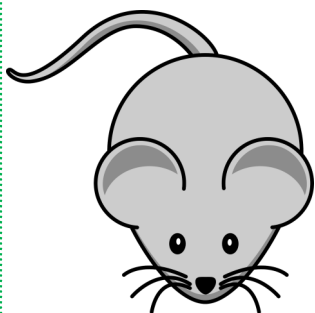

Teachers have associated hunger with the inability to concentrate on schoolwork, behavioral issues, and an increased likelihood to report feeling sick. The impact of childhood hunger doesn't just stop at the classroom. Children who don't have stable access to healthy food are less likely to complete high school or even be able to adequately feed their own families as adults.

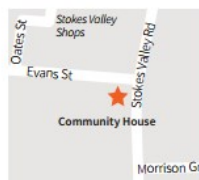

1. Measure your window from the outside edges of the window frame, in centimetres.

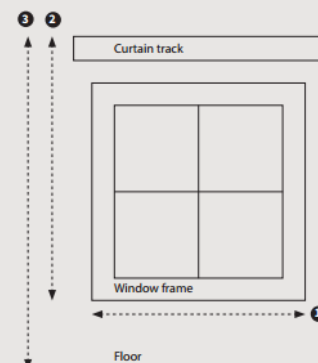
Length

2. Measure from the top of the curtain track to the bottom of the window frame, in centimetres.

Drop

3. Measure from the top of the curtain track to the floor, in centimetres.

Note: If you do not have a curtain track, measure from the top of the window frame.

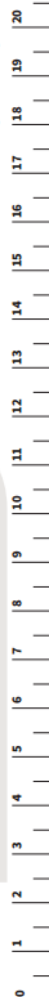
